Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is additional funding provided to schools for supporting children who are at a greater risk of under-achievement.

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils

We ensure that children belonging to vulnerable groups, including those from socially disadvantaged backgrounds, are adequately assessed and provision is made to meet their needs

In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged

We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged will be in receipt of free school meals. We therefore reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any groups of pupils that the school deems to be socially disadvantaged

Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is additional funding provided to schools for supporting children who are at a greater risk of underachievement.

Children eligible for Pupil Premium include:

Children who are in the care of the local authority (known as Looked after Children)

Children adopted from care on or after 30 December 2005 or left care under

- a Special Guardianship Order on or after 30 December 2005
- a Residence Order on or after 14 October 1991

Children whose family qualify for, or have qualified for in the past six years, free school meals by household income.

Children of armed services personnel.

Terms in which the Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to schools:

The grant may be spent in the following ways:

For the purposes of the school i.e. for the educational benefit of pupils registered at the school
For the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools or academies

On community facilities e.g. services whose provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the locality in which the school is situated

The grant does not have to be completely spent by schools in the financial year in which it is received; some or all of it may be carried forward to future financial years

Principles:

Allocation 2018-2019: £23,643

Per Child: £1320

All the work through pupil premium is aimed at accelerating progress, moving children to at least age related expectations; initially this will be in English and Mathematics. Pupil premium resources may also be used to target able children, who are eligible for the funding, to achieve Mastery at the end of KS1 and/or KS2.

How pupil premium was spent in 2018/19

Small group interventions for reading, writing and maths

Extra-curricular clubs and activities to support social, emotional and language skills, provide wider opportunities for pupils and maintain high attendance figures

Friendship groups to support with confidence and self esteem

Subsidising educational visits, residential trips and purchasing enhancements to enrich the curriculum

Computing resources to provide children with learning opportunities beyond school

Specialist Sports coaching to promote confidence and well-being
