

Maths

- * Place value for numbers up to 1000.
- * Addition & Subtraction for numbers up to 1000– using formal methods (column) and appropriate mental methods.
- * Multiplication– Children should know 2s, 5s, and 10s.
- * Division– equivalent divisions to the multiplications e.g. $7 \times 8 = 56$ so $56 \div 8 = 7$.
- * Length—writing length in metres and centimetres and kilometres and metres.

English

- * Spelling rules and common exception words.
- * Grammar including using noun phrases, punctuating speech, using paragraphs, using fronted adverbials and appropriate nouns and pronouns.
- * Reading fluently and understanding what is read.
- * Writing poetry, playscripts, Norse Myths and non-chronological reports.
- * Class read- “The Spiderwick Chronicles” by Tony DiTerlizzi and Holly Black

Science

Skeletal and muscular systems. Within this, children will learn about:

- * Nutrition and what the human body needs.
- * Our skeleton and the names of the bones
- * Our muscles

Lights and shadows. Within this, children will learn about:

- * Looking at sun safety
- * Investigating reflective materials
- * Looking at opaque, transparent and translucent objects

Geography

These include:

- * Seas and continents of the world
- * Countries and capital Cities of UK
- * How to use an atlas to locate countries and rivers across the world.
- * Describing places using physical (natural) and human (manmade) features
- * Compass directions
- * Using a key.
- * Using fieldwork to study local geography
