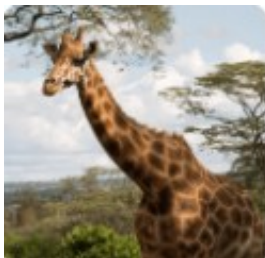


Pentecost 1— Animal Safari

In the Animal Safari project, your child will learn about incredible animals that live worldwide. They will explore various animal habitats and compare the animals that live there with animals in their locality. They will learn how to care for pets and what all animals need to grow, survive and stay happy and healthy. They will explore animal features and find out how they survive in the wild. They will compare the ways that animals are similar and different.



Maths

Maths is taught daily as a whole class. Activities take place following input and through a balance of adult led and child led learning.

- Building numbers to 20
- Adding and taking away within 20
- Doubling
- Sharing and grouping
- Odd and even numbers
- Patterns

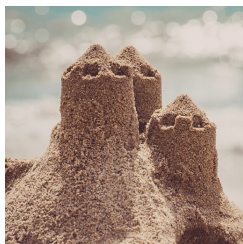
Phonics/English

Phonics and English is taught in groups and through adult led and continuous provision, focussing on these outcomes:

- To be able to read words consistent with their sound knowledge by blending.
- To read simple sentences and books consistent with their phonic knowledge.
- To write their name independently
- To write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.

Pentecost 2—On the Beach

In the On the Beach project, your child will learn about animals that live in rock pools and on the seashore. They will explore days out at the beach and compare their experiences with beach holidays in the past. They will learn about the animals that live in the sea and find out about worldwide seas and oceans. They will explore the importance of looking after the environment to keep living things safe. They will learn about staying safe at the beach and find out about people who help us.
