Created and Loved by God

Created and Loved by God explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are created by God out of love and for love, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships. We talk about the Creation story and how God knows and loves each and every one of us.

We will be completing baseline assessments with the children this half term. These involve observing the children in the classroom, getting to know them through their play and completing one to one activities with them such as counting and reading a story with them. We can then tailor our teaching and the classroom environment to help support the children.

Advent 1— Exploring Autumn

This topic focusses on the experiences of Autumn the children have already (What is Autumn and what might we do in autumn). The children will be looking at what happens during Autumn regarding changes in nature. This includes types of animals, habitats and what they may eat. The children will be encouraged to explore the outside spaces around school and outside of school. They can go on hunts and share finding with each other and make comparisons to other times of the year.

Phonics/English

Phonics is taught as a whole class for the first half term with other adult led activities set up in the classroom. Our teaching will include:

- Teaching sounds through our phonics programme Read Write Inc.
- Blending sounds to make simple words e.g. cat, man.
- Focus on handwriting and correct letter formation.
- Writing our names independently.
- Listening to stories and singing familiar songs and rhymes.

Maths is taught daily as a whole class. This term, we will be looking at different mathematical concepts including:

- Matching, sorting and comparing objects.
- Comparing size, mass and capacity
- Exploring patterns and sequencing
- Reading, writing, counting and showing the numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5
- Recognising and naming shapes

Continuous Provision

The classroom is set up to maximise learning opportunities for the children. This will be a balance of adult led and child initiated learning and will be linked to our current topic as well as following the children's interests.

Our carefully planned continuous provision enables our children to learn skills, challenge their thinking and supports them to embed concepts. It is within this learning environment that the children will also develop key learning attributes and encourages children's engagement, independence, collaboration, self-confidence, resilience and curiosity.

Children have a weekly singing session with Mrs Jack, a PE slot on Friday morning, they will also begin Forest School after the half term break (we will keep you updated).
